Planning Board – The board meets the first Tuesday of each month at 10:30 a.m. The board consists of seven members, appointed by the village council. The term of a Planning Board member is three years. The board advises and makes recommendations to the village council regarding proposed land development plans, subdivision applications and other development requests.

Board of Adjustment – Meets on an as needed basis. The board hears variance requests, conditional use applications, and zoning appeals. Under the laws of the State of North Carolina, counties and municipalities are given the authority to zone property within the municipal limits. The Village of Flat Rock has developed its own zoning ordinance known as the Land Development Ordinance (LDO). The village Zoning Administrator (ZA) is responsible for interpreting and enforcing the ordinance. From time to time, questions and/or disputes may arise from decisions made by the ZA. If a decision is appealed, the Board of Adjustment (BOA) is responsible for hearing the case and making a decision regarding the appeal. In addition, the BOA grants variances from requirements of the LDO, interprets disputed lot lines or district boundaries and deals with similar questions.

Park Commission – Works on development, management and maintenance of the Park at Flat Rock. The Park Commission consists of three to five members appointed by the village council, serving three-year terms. The commission assists in identifying volunteer activities that would enhance the park, develops policies, reviews design of all structures in the park and addresses council and citizen concerns.

Office Back-up – Receptionist like duties. Notification may be short.

Historic Landmarks Commission – The commission consists of three council members appointed by the mayor, and two community representatives appointed by the council. The commission establishes a historic landmarks inventory, recommends the designation of historic landmarks to the village council and considers requests for proposed changes to historic landmarks.

Kudzu Committee – Group works to control kudzu on private properties within the Village. Members of the committee unlimited in number are appointed by the council.

Other – From time to time Council needs input from people of various educational and professional backgrounds who would be acting in the role of consultants.
